Timeline

2013

- The SRVC (Society for Rehabilitation of the Visually Challenged) put together the first Indian National Blind Football team with the Indian Blind Sports Association, New Delhi.
- In their first-ever international event, held in Bangkok in August, the Indian Blind Football team reached the Semi-Finals and ended fourth.

2014

• Enroute to the International Five Nation Blind Football Tournament in Hong Kong in December, the Indian Blind Football team played a friendly game in Malaysia with the host team. The tour was prepared for a fortnight in early December under the supervision of Mr. W K Loo, an international referee coordinator and trainer from Malaysia.

2015

- In January, India was ranked 28th in the world as per IBSA rankings.
- Before the squad flew to Japan in September, they attended a preparatory camp in Kochi, led by Mr. W K Loo from Malaysia, for the Asian Championships in Japan (which was a Rio Paralympics qualifier).
- In December, Elias Mastoras, a referee coordinator, including the recent Paralympics, held a referee coaching session in Kerala, India, for potential blind football referees.

- In January, India moved up to 25th position as per IBSA world rankings.
- The All-India Invitational Blind Football Tournament, which featured 86 blind footballers and was held at Aluva Blind School in April and May, was won by the Kerala squad.
- IBFF and SRVC organised a road show and blind football camp in Kolkata and the North East, including Tura, Meghalaya, Guwahati, Shillong, and Imphal, in September.
- The Indian Blind Football Federation (IBFF), which is supported by SRVC, was
 recognized by the Paralympic Committee of India in October'16 as the country's only
 recognised organisation for promoting blind football and focusing emphasis on the sport.

- In October, the IBFF undertook its second visit of the North East, with Mr. W K Loo from Malaysia leading a four-day training programme in Shillong, Meghalaya.
- Malaysia, Laos, and hosts India competed in the first-ever India International Blind
 Football Championship, which was held in Kochi from December 1 to 4. Malaysia won
 the event. Prior to this, 18 players from across India were invited to the National
 Selection camp in November which is led by Mr. W K Loo.

2017

- In January, India's world ranking became 23rd based on international matches played.
- A training camp was held in Aizawl in January, followed by a four-team Mini North East Blind Football Tournament in Shillong in February. The championship was won by Bethany Society, Shillong.
- Blind Football awareness camps were organised in Kozhikode in February, followed by Mumbai and Olassa Blind School Kottayam in March.
- In March, a Demo game and Awareness camp were held in Delhi.
- NIVH Dehradun won the second edition of the All-India Invitational Blind Football Tournament, which was held in Kerala in April.
- As Part of The Grassroots Day Event in Bengaluru, IBFF Conducted a Blind Football Demo Session. At the Bengaluru Football Stadium, a friendly game was played between KWAB Bengaluru and the SRVC Kerala Blind Football team.
- On the 3rd of September, the IBSA World Blind Football Chairman and German National Team Coach, Mr Ulrich Pfister, inaugurated the First Blind Football Academy for the first batch of ten members in Kochi, Kerala. Shri Alphons Kanathanam, Union Minister of Sports and Industry, enrolled the Academy's first Trainee.
- In September, IBFF Organized a demo game at INS Venduruthy, a naval facility, and Lulu Mall Kochi in November.
- In December, IBFF held an interaction session with the Kerala blasters team and the blind football academy team in Kochi, Kerala. In front of the Kerala blasters, IBFF academy players played a demo game.

2018

• In January, the IBFF academy team played a Demo game in Mumbai, Maharashtra, Shri Aditya Thackeray, and Chairman MDFA was the Chief Guest.

- The Indian Blind Football Federation (IBFF) hosted the Second Edition of the North East Blind Football Tournament at Montfort Centre of Education Tura, Meghalaya. From the 27th to the 30th of January, the North East Sowers Blind Football Club emerged victorious, defeating Delhi in the finals on the 30th of January.
- IBFF hosted a national team selection camp and a fitness training camp in February in preparation for the world grand prix in Japan. Danny Deigan, the Australian fitness and performance coach for the AIFF Indian National Football Team, has led fitness and training sessions for the blind footballers.
- On March 11th, IBFF held a Blind Football Demo Game and a Blind Folded Walk at Decathlon in Kochi.
- From the 10th to the 17th of March, a National Blind Football Camp was held for selected members in preparation for the World Grand Prix, Japan development category games. The sessions were led by international referee Mr. WK. Loo.
- From March 21 to 25, the Indian blind football squad competed in the inaugural World Grand Prix Blind Football Tournament in the Development Games Category, against the Japan National Training Centre team and Belgium.
- The IBFF held the Third National Blind Football Tournament in Kochi from April 27th to May 1st, and the Kochi blind football academy team won the tournament.
- The IBFF held the Thailand and India Blind Football Combined Training Sessions in Kochi, Kerala from July 23 to 26, as part of a skills exchange programme to develop the National Academy Team, that features Indian players, for the future.
- From August 31 to September 2, the IBFF hosted the first edition of the South & West Zonal Blind Football Tournament in Bengaluru. The first South West Zonal competition was won by SRVC Kerala.
- From the 17th to the 22nd of September, the IBFF hosted an international friendly series and combined training sessions between the Australian and Indian blind football teams in Kochi, India. The series was won by India (2-0)
- The Kerala Blasters' Manjappada Official Fan Club honoured members of the India team while they were in Kochi last week for matches against Australia in September
- The Blind Football Demo Game was held on the 6th and 7th of October at the Adidas the Football Base Plaza Venue in Chattarpur, Delhi, between the Delhi Blind Football Team and the NIVH Dehradun Team.

- From the 5th to the 7th of December, a Blind Football Goalkeeper Training Session with AIFF National Goalkeeper Coach Rogerio Ramos was held.
- On the 10th of December, as part of Disability Awareness Week, the IBFF organised a Blind Football Demo Game at the SH College Lake View Ground in Thevara to showcase the talents of the visually challenged Blind Footballers.

- Sunil J Mathew, the Indian Blind Football Federation's Sporting Director, met with the Indian National Team Coaches and AFC top officials in Abu Dhabi in January to examine the possibility of creating additional Blind Football centres around India.
- From the 23rd to the 26th of January, the IBFF hosted the Third North East Blind Football Tournament in Meghalaya. After a hard-fought final against the NESBFC North East team, Bethany Society won the Third North East Blind Football Tournament.
- From the 26th to the 28th of February, the Indian Blind Football Federation (IBFF) hosted a First-Ever Coaches and Players Training Sessions with England Football Association Blind Football Coaches and Trainers in Kochi, Kerala.
- On March 8, the IBFF and Kerala Blind Football Federation collaborated to hold a Blind Football Training Session at the School for the Blind in Trivandrum.
- From the 12th to the 15th of April, the IBFF hosted the Fourth IBFF National Blind Football Tournament at Fever pitch Ground in Yeshwantpur, Bengaluru. The National Title was won by Bethany Society Shillong, Meghalaya.
- On the 15th of April, the IBFF hosted the First-Ever Women's B1 Game during the Men's Nationals in Bengaluru. For the first time, the two women's blind football teams competed in a demo game with female goalkeepers, officials, coaches, and guides.
- On the 17th of July, the Indian Blind Football Federation had an interaction session with AIFF officials and coaches in Ahmedabad. The National Team players had the

opportunity to meet with Igor Stimac, the Head Coach of the Indian Football Team, and the coaching staff.

- The first ever official B2 / B3 partially sighted game was held on September 9th at the Aluva Blind School Grounds in Kochi, with an enthusiastic group of B2 and B3 players from across Kerala.
- The IBSA Blind Football Asian Championship (Thailand, Pattaya'19) was held between 1st to 6th October. The Indian Blind Football Team secured its highest position, finishing 5th Overall Beating Higher Ranked Teams Like Malaysia (World Ranked 17th) 2-0 for the 5th Place at the IBSA The Asian Blind Football Championship, Pattaya. The selection camp for this tournament was held for a month at the academy at Kochi
- From the 16th to the 17th of November, the IBFF hosted the second edition of the Regional East Zone Blind Football Tournament and training session in Kolkata. FABB Kolkata won the title after a penalty shootout victory over GNBFC Tura in the final at the Rabindra Bharati University grounds in Kolkata.
- During the East Zone competition held at Rabindra Bharathi University Ground in Kolkata on November 17th, the Indian Blind Football Federation organised a women's blind football demo game and a training session. The session brought twelve girls, including two female goalkeepers. They played an exhibition game, and few goals were scored on the day.
- During the East Zone Tournament on November 17th at Rabindra Bharathi University Ground in Kolkata, the Indian Blind Football Federation held a B2/B3 football (for partially sighted) game.
- On December 3rd, the Indian Blind Football Federation and SRVC hosted a game and interaction with the stars of the ISL Kerala Blasters FC squad, which was sponsored by Jain Tubes, the official sponsor, to celebrate World Disability Day.
- In India, a Memorable Night for Blind Football! On the 13th of December, the ISL game between KBF and JFC witnessed Indian blind football players walking hand in hand into the field with some of the game's stars. the Indian Blind Football Federation arranged a penalty shootout with KBFC players and for the first time in India, organized an audio descriptive commentary session at the stadium.
- From the 17th to the 20th of December, the IBFF held a three-match international Friendly series in Kochi, Kerala, in which the Indian Development Team (B team) defeated the Japan Development Team (B team). The three-match series was won by the Indian Development team (2-1)

2020

- On the 25th of January, the IBFF hosted a blind football demo game in Kakkand, with Olympian PR Sreejesh as the chief guest.
- On the 15th and 16th of February, the IBFF held a first-time training camp for blind footballers, coaches, and referees in Nagaland at the Don Bosco School Grounds in Dimapur in collaboration with the Disability Commissioners Office of Nagaland, Prodigals Home, and NSDF. A demo game was also held between the Shillong & Tura teams and also played a demo game between Nagaland Women's Teams
- On the 18th of February, the IBFF held a blind football introductory training session at the Bhimbhar School for the Blind in Siliguri. The practice gathered around 20 players, including 10 boys and 10 girls.
- During the lockdown period from July to December, the IBFF held webinar sessions with foreign coaches and players on the 20th of each month. Coaches and players from Germany, England, Brazil, Argentina, Japan, Australia, and Thailand addressed a variety of blind football topics. On July 20th, Ulrich Peisterer, Chairman of the IBSA Blind Football Committee, inaugurated the Webinar session.
- On December 3, 2020, IBFF, SRVC, and Chavara Cultural Centre together celebrated World Disability Day with programmes showcasing the skills of the differently-abled. A Blind Football demonstration and a penalty shootout were among the attractions.

- After a year of shutdown due to covid restrictions, the IBFF National Academy in Kochi reopened in February. A group of six players is still being trained on a daily basis and is being offered vocational training opportunities.
- At the Gamma Football Arena in Kadavanthara Kochi, the IBFF hosted the first Blind Football Training Camp and Demo Game for Women. The session, which took place from the 26th to the 28th of February, attracted over 20 participants from Kerala, Pune, Bangalore, and Chennai, including female players, coaches, goalkeepers, and referees. DCP Ms Aishwarya Dongre IPS inaugurated the camp and Mrs Sheela kouchouseph distributed the certificate to the participants.
- Between the 2nd and 4th of April, the Kerala blind football team participated in a three-day football camp held by the society for rehabilitation of the visually challenged and the Indian blind football federation at the Gamma football stadium in Kadavanthra. Mr. Pradeep Dutta, Associate Professor of Sports Authority of India, LNCPE Campus, Thiruvananthapuram, officially inaugurated the camp.

- The First Partially Sighted Blind Football was held in Kerala on October 21st at the Mar Charles Lavigne Indoor Stadium, S B College, Changanacherry, by the Indian Blind Football Federation (IBFF) and the Kerala Blind Football Federation. The Chief Guest for the Finals was Adv Job Michael MLA, Changanacherry.
